Investment objective & strategy

To achieve long-term capital growth through equity or equity related investments predominantly in the stock markets of India. The Fund will also invest in companies traded in other markets where a significant proportion of growth in their underlying business is set to derive from India.


The Fund offers access to the equity market of one of the largest and the fastest-growing economies in the world. Our investment approach results in a concentrated and high conviction portfolio of stocks benefitting from the India growth opportunity. We are long term investors and focus on quality at a management, promoter and franchise level in companies offering valuations with a favourable risk-reward balance that exhibit superior compounding potential over time.

Commentary

- Indian equities posted decent returns in October with mainline indices closing just shy of all-time highs. MSCI India gained 3.83% outperforming MSCI World index (Developed Markets) which rose 2.57%. India slightly underperformed MSCI Emerging Markets which added 4.23% (USD terms, total return). Market divergence within India continued with the Nifty mid-cap index outperforming large caps (Nifty mid-cap up 4.96% versus Nifty 3.70% INR total returns) whilst small-cap indices underperformed. The INR weakened marginally on the month versus the USD.
- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) cut the policy rate by 25 basis points at its October meeting and at the same time downgraded its fiscal year 2020 growth target to 6.1% from 6.9% earlier. With RBI inflation expectations being under 4% for the year ahead, RBI Governor Mr. Das highlighted that an accommodative stance will remain for as long as necessary. Economic data continues to reflect the deterioration in domestic demand indicators, so the RBI and government will likely be pursuing growth orientated policies for some time to come.
- We are past the mid-point of India's 2nd quarter fiscal year 2020 earnings season which to date have been slightly better than expected. Certain trends are already visible, with weakness at the top line (due to weak domestic demand) counterbalanced by decent profits which have been aided by tax cut benefits. Up to this point positive earnings surprises are outweighing negative ones. Broader market results so far are better than mainline indices reflecting more domestic orientated earnings (and hence tax cut benefits).




